**The disasters at Chernobyl and Fukushima are far from over. Hundreds to thousands of square miles of contaminated land must remain uninhabited indefinitely.

**There are 14 nuclear reactors within 100 miles of Chicago. Each reactor contains the radioactive content of 1000 Hiroshima bombs.

The Obama Administration continues to assure the U.S. nuclear industry of its continued support despite the fact that American nuclear plants are aging, human error can never be prevented, and nature is endlessly creative. Just within the last few weeks, flood waters have dangerously surrounded two reactors on the Missouri River in Nebraska.

What can we do in this situation? Getting better informed is a first step. The 2006 film, "The Battle of Chernobyl," recounts a stark history and provides information that will help us understand our own situation.
